Hello all,



If you did not make it to the fall retreat this year, you missed out on amazing fishing and fellowship. For me, this was a weekend I will never forget. This was my second year attending the fall retreat and decided to bring my Dad. Even though I grew up with Fishing for Life and going to Deep C's my Dad wasn't able to get that involved. He brought me to my first Marathon Man event at the Docks of Maynard's on Minnetonka and had been to a couple of the banquets. This year has been a year of many hardships and changes for my family and knew I needed to get my Dad back into the thing that has always brought him joy.

Growing up my best memories were spent fishing with my Dad and Grandpa for a week up at a cabin in Cass County. This is where I grew up in fishing and learning from my Dad. As I grew up and life got crazier, the less I was able to get out fishing with my Dad. This was right about the time I found Fishing for Life. The first time I saw the mobile trout pond at the Christian Community fair I knew I had to get as involved as I could. This year I have felt like I have been able to reconnect my dad to fishing and the great outdoors. Back in 2008 my Dad's boat broke down and he hasn't had one since, but for Father's Day I bought him one at our Annual Boat auction which has got him hooked once again.

As Dad and I were driving up to Mount Carmel so many memories came flooding in. We drove through the rain and wind while worshiping God and I realized this was going to be the first Christian retreat my Dad and I have been on together and knew



God was going to bless this time. The first night was a great time of fellowship and worship. In the History of the DeepC's fall retreat no one had ever caught a Muskie and knew I had to get my Dad to be the first. That first day a lot of people stayed on Lake Carlos chain of lakes, but I knew I had to fish the rough waters of Lake Miltona, the largest lake in the region. When we got out on the water it was white caps everywhere with four foot swells. We pounded across the lake to a promising looking area that was a little bit out of the wind. In the first fifteen minutes we saw our first Muskie. In the next hour we had six follows and two strikes, but no fish. I decided I knew this was a promising spot and headed to my second location. We started casting and in less than fifteen minutes it was fish on. My dad was casting a deep diver off the back of the boat and hooks into a Muskie. As he's fighting the fish I rush for the net and in one quick swoop I had the fish in the net and in the boat. I was shaking! I could not believe the first fish God blesses my dad was a twenty seven inch Muskie. We take the measurement and picture and release the fish. We keep fishing this weed line and catch three more species to bring his score to 80 inches the first day. My Dad was in the lead, but only by six inches.

We had dinner and enjoyed Chapel together and I could feel God moving in both our hearts. Pastor Dan talked on the story of Jesus and the Demoniac and how Jesus broke every social norm just to save this one soul and how he cares personally about every soul on earth and he brings calm and peace into a life that is otherwise full of chaos. I could see God doing this for my Dad though this weekend.

After chapel we looked at the weather and saw it was going to be the perfect night to get out on the water. We knew that if my dad was going to hold his lead he needed to up his inches through the night. So we decided we needed to get to a couple of hours of sleep in and then hit the water. We were on the water by 1:00 AM and casted for muskies under the full moon for two hours. After no luck, I knew I needed to change up and get him some inches. By 5:45 he increased his inches by twenty eight inches breaking the highest score of any fall retreat. We walked into breakfast with 108 inches.

After breakfast and chapel we headed back out to see if we could improve our score. Fishing was hard but we still caught fish. At this point it's lunch time and my back is killing me. We decided to call it a day and head in early with a grand total of 118 inches.

Saturday night most people would think my highlight would have been my dad sweeping the board with largest muskie, largest walleye, largest sunny, and most inches but they would have been wrong. That night my dad had opened up and shared part of his testimony and I was in tears. I am in tears just writing this. This was the first time I had ever heard my dad open up, especially in a group of people, and share his story. He was open and honest on where he was and I couldn't have been more proud. I want to thank everyone that came to this fall retreat and helped make it so special. I close with my life passage. Hebrews 10:23-25 - 23 Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for He who promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, 25 not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another-and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

WILD TURKEY BUTTER BURGERS

Ingredients:

- 2lb ground wild turkey
- 2 slices of bacon, chopped
- 1 white onion, diced small
- 1T bourbon
- 1T fresh thyme chopped
- 1/2 lb butter, softened
- Salt and ground black pepper
- 6 Aged white cheddar slices
- 6 Brioche burger buns



Directions:

- In a heavy bottomed pan, preferably cast iron, sauté the bacon for a couple of minutes and add the diced onions. Sweat the mixture until the onions are just translucent. Don't brown the onions too much. Add the bourbon and flambé. Turn off heat and add fresh thyme. Fold this into the ground turkey mixture and chill for 15 minutes.
- 2. Patty the turkey mixture into 6oz balls and hand form burger patty's evenly so they cook evenly. Using the same pan that was used for the bacon-onions, cook the turkey patty's on each side for 3-4minutes or until the center reads 165F on a digital thermometer. Top with cheese when flipped.
- 3. Butter each bun with 1-2T soft butter and toast cut side down in the pan that was used to cook the burgers.

With the beginning of fall, change is officially upon us. The water temps in most lakes keep dropping and turnover will begin to happen on many lakes in the next 30 days. Turnover is the process that warmer water in the upper water column cools to a point where it mixes with the bottom layer to become a constant water temperature. This happens on lakes that develop a thermocline during the summer. Some shallower or wind swept lakes like Mille Lacs and Devils Lake don't have thermoclines. Fishing can be tough during this turnover process. One recommendation is to look for shallower lakes during this time that have already turned over or never had a thermocline. Once the turnover process is complete, it's not unusual to find fish like walleyes in 50-60ft of water feeding on bait fish. Post turnover fish are usually hungry and looking to add some weight before winter.



My National Walleye Tour Update:

This was my first official full season fishing the Cabela's National Walleye tour. In 2018, I left Devils Lake, ND at 118 place in the Cabela's National Walleye Tour. Thankfully, I found some nice fish in 45 feet of water during pre-fishing on a rock/mud transition that held very nice fish. I used my Humminbird Mega SI to stay on the rock/mud transition. Jigging raps and the brand new Eagle Claw prov bend 1/16 jigs under slip bobbers where the ticked to catch all the fish. I ended up with 35.92lbs after my 1lb dead fish penalty and 12th place at the National Walleye Tour Championship. I was just .08lbs out of making the top 10. I will tell the whole amazing story this winter at the Roger's Deep C meeting.


