How We Roll

"Divinely inspired... with the Lord's prompting"

I often get asked how Fishing for Life (FFL) got so big, why I started it and other questions like that. I thought I would try and explain a bit about our programming and how it has evolved. For the most part, I believe FFL was divinely inspired, the programs came about as a result of great timing and the

Lords' prompting us to move in that direction.

We first started with lake events. When I returned home from Afghanistan, I started with a simple objective of getting kids on the water. I soon had my first event on White Bear Lake which multiplied to many lake events.

We simultaneously began the Fish-A-Thon, a program used to raise funds for urban ministry's that were struggling to stay alive. I had a heart for these urban kids and saw a great need so I asked many of the kids fishing our lake events to participate in an event called Fish-A-Thon. It was a month-long event with a great pledge packet that helped kids go door to door asking donors to pledge for a quarter for every fish they caught that month. We raised over 50k total on year one but it was hard work. We stayed with it for 4 years, raising around \$200,000 for urban ministries. The board and I had a very long discussion about moving our entire nonprofit to being more ministry-based and less Fish-A-Thon/fundraising-based. After much soul searching, we decided to go down the path of ministry.

Fast-forward 15 years and we currently have eight core ministries: Deep C's Men's Club, Newly formed Women's Adventure Group, Military R&R (Relationships through Recreation), Reel 'Em In (REI-Sporting goods/boat collection & Rebuilding program), Mobile Trout Ponds, NextGEN Mentor Program, High C's Fishing Camps, and Lake Events. Our programs are focused on serving youth, families, veteran's & communities through fishing & outdoor programs.

Marathon Man

More than Just a lot of Fish!

This year's Marathon Man event was the best ever!

A bit of history: When I first started Fishing for Life, I was working a kid's minnow race at a wild game feed at a metro church. I met a man named Jeff Kolodzinski who was the buyer for Gander Mountain stores. He was the keynote speaker at the game feed and took a liking to our minnow race game along with my story of returning from Afghanistan and starting FFL. Jeff asked how he could help and with no real idea, I said he could do a 24-hour marathon of fishing, which he reluctantly agreed too.

We bounced around for a few years and raised awareness along with honing our craft. We felt like Tom Sawyer a Huck Finn. It was two guys, committed to a cause, figuring things out and a brotherhood of fun. This actually has all the aroma of Christ! We

bounced from lake to lake, not taking the marathon portion too seriously until we landed at the docks of Maynard's restaurant on Lake Minnetonka. We struck Gold! It was ideally set up for big numbers, multiple docks, swarms of sunfish and kids feeding them French fries all day.

After a few years of recording big numbers of fish in 24 hours, we really buckled down in 2011 and hired the Guinness Book of World Records for a qualifying run and BINGO! We had the first record of 2,143 fish in 24

hours. I still remember the celebration after establishing the Guinness record and also, Jeff's exhaustion.

Two years later, there was a move of the Spirit. We all sensed the event was shutting down and we allowed it! It was sad but Jeff moved on to bigger things as Frankie's brand manager and then to Hummingbird. I moved on to very big growth years for FFL. We also focused on our families. We kept in touch and almost landed a new Mar-

athon Man event in Florida but we had to decline. We did not know why God was holding us back? We loved it, wanted it and seemingly, needed it.

Well, 10 years later, God has turned it into quite a spectacle.

In 2018, Jeff hit the golden ticket. The Giant Goose Ranch in Illinois wanted to bring us to their location to beat the Guinness Book record. I was hesitant at first since I had conducted all planning and organizing in the past and just did not have the band width to do so again. Jeff and the owners of the Ranch took the bull by the horns. This was not your little start up Marathon Man that I was used too. It was now a full fledged internet-based event.

By waiting on the Lord, we were free to focus on FFL and allow the event to mature, and for the Giant Goose Ranch plan to develop! The remaining piece was a guy named Teeg Stouffer that brought it all home for Jeff and I.

Teeg is a true laborer in the field. Immensely talented and as our mc and producer he was more than the "cherry on the top." After 2 years of Marathon Man, Jeff easily broke his record at our new location, the Giant Goose Ranch in IL. And while the location is amazing, this event is so much more than just the location... It's Gods' promise of abundance if we can remain faithful and obedient to Him.

The money raised is such a blessing to us and will help to run our NextGEN mentoring program which focuses on Veteran families. Thanks Marathon Man!

Hello from Deep C's

Deep C's Men's Ministry is celebrating its 9th year. Over that time there have been 8 Fall Retreats, 6 Winter Retreats and roughly 250 monthly Deep C's meetings. Every time Deep C's meets the gospel is shared and God is glorified. With all that said I wonder how many of you know what the C's in Deep C's stand for? When we started Deep C's, we knew there would be people from all walks of life with a love for fishing. We wanted Deep C's to not only be a group of men who love fishing but also men who have a love for God. The challenge was how do we meet men where they are in their spiritual life and how would we help them move forward in their walk with God. By using the C's, we allowed men to personally assess where they were in their walk with God. It would be up to us to help them advance to the next "C". It has been a very rewarding 9 years. We have made many great friends who not only love fishing but also have a hunger to increase their relationship with God. I have listed the C's below and there meaning. I pray you may grow closer to God by reading the meaning of each "C".

CHOSEN—WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE CHOSEN BY GOD?

The phrase "chosen by God" is used in a variety of ways. The Bible is very clear that there are people chosen by God to do specific things. This simply means at some point God made the choice for something to happen according to His perfect wisdom, foreknowledge, and will. Because of this, God's choices are perfect and will result in the fulfillment of His perfect will.

CREATED—WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE CREATED BY GOD?

We can summarize the reason why God created us in this sentence: We were created by God to worship Him, to glorify Him, predestined to do good works for Him, to share Jesus Christ's gospel with the lost, and to enjoy Him for eternity. This is the chief purpose of mankind. I believe that I could enjoy that forever – for that is what I was created for. If you are a believer in Jesus Christ, then you know your purpose in life. If you are not, perhaps today is the day of your salvation (2 Cor 6:2). If you choose life, place your trust in Jesus, put your faith in His saving grace, and confess you are a sinner in need of a Savior, then you too have just found your purpose. This is the reason for which God created you.

CALLED—WHY GOD CALLED US?

You've probably heard the phrase "the call of God," but maybe you don't know exactly what it means. Is the Lord still calling people, or was that something He did only in Bible times? Does He speak only to a specific few or to everyone? Although He may not use an audible voice, He's still in the business of seeking followers. **Called to Salvation**—Because sin has created a barrier between us and God, He first reaches out to establish a relationship with us by offering salvation through Christ. **Called to Sanctification**—Once we have been reconciled to the Lord, He then calls us to sanctification or holiness. This means that He sets us apart for His purposes. Although this is an act of God that begins now at salvation and continues until our physical death, it also requires a commitment from us. If we choose not to cooperate with the Lord in this process, our growth in Christlikeness will be hindered. **Called to Service**—God has chosen to carry out His work in the world through those who are saved. He has determined the tasks He wants each of us to do; our job is to serve Him by accomplishing what He's planned for us.

CLEANSSED—WHY GOD CLEANSSES US?

Paul writes, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So, glorify God in your body" (2nd Cor 6:19-20). We must be holy, pure, and clean if we are to serve the Lord. We have been forgiven when we are saved, but we need cleansing in order to serve. We are cleansed "by the washing with water through the Word" (Eph 5:26). God's Word exposes sin in our life. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness (1 John 1:9).

COMMISSIONED—WHY GOD COMMISSIONS US?

When you share the gospel, you're not responsible for the outcome. God is! Part of the great commission is to "make disciples of all nations", meaning that this gospel should be preached to the whole world (Matt 28:19-20). A disciple is literally one that is disciplined or taught about the Kingdom of God and these disciples are to make disciples or students of other people once they have put their trust in Christ. Christianity is not a covert operation! We must all tell others the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ. To be discipled is to be instructed or to learn from one who is a disciple themselves. We can never teach what we first do not possess and so once a person receives saving faith from God, they are to impart this to others and to teach others to "obey all that [Jesus has] commanded" us.

Over the last many months we have talked to over 25 various military agencies, Beyond the Yellow Ribbon, National Guard Outreach, Army Family Outreach, Trust Vets, Wounded Warriors, and many others. All of them felt we had a great opportunity for some veteran families and their kids. guardians with kids like the ones in the pictures.

Many of you already know about the wonderful NextGEN program started in 2016 under the leadership of Vaughn Blackburn, it has provided a great foundation and many significant relationships. Also we have some terrific men and women who have been trained as NextGEN guides and also coached in basic mentoring skills for the added emphasis on mentoring the vets kids in this program in life skills and spiritual growth, as well as, outdoor appreciation.

Please tell anyone you know in your circles who may be a veteran with young kids about this program. **Please help us get the word out and share with your church and your networks .I would be very pleased to come and share a brief message on the program and how this is truly a significant Kingdom mission... right here in our "home front". Some of you may wonder why we spend so much time and resources on trout ponds and sport shows when we can't "truly" minister to people at these events. Well for me, I would have never found Fishing for Life if I didn't walk down those stairs into the Christian Community fair. These shows get us in front of families, men and women looking for something more but don't know what that is yet. Trout ponds are our "bait and switch." We get adults and kids interested in what we do and "release" them into our other programs which help keep us growing. Not only do we get more people involved, in some cases sport shows are also a source of income for our organization.

During the fall and winter time we get some out of state trout ponds. This November I have my first to kick off the season at the Bismarck Event Center the 15th and 16th. This one may only be a fund raising event but we still get to help kids get hooked on fishing. This is the second year we have done this show and I am excited to be returning. Last year I was able to bless a church with the left over trout for a cook out. It's not every time though I get lucky enough to find someone to buy or take the trout at the end of these events. there has been times I've had to clean trout in a hotel bathroom, which always makes for a great story.

In order to run twelve camps, and service all these campers, we needed one guide to every 2-3 campers, which means a total of 77 men and women were needed to accommodate our 202 campers and Jr. guides. Over nine species of fish were caught, but the most common were Crappie, LM Bass, Muskie, Northern, Perch, Rock Bass, SM Bass, Sunfish, and Walleye. The campers enjoyed the competition and rewards at the end of the amazing week. As the "camp that goes home with the kid", many times, we have campers from our summer camps attend one of our monthly events. We had a total of 148 campers join us for one of these 12 events this year. Thank you for making it possible for these campers to enjoy this wonderful experience! Please pray for the campers that made spiritual decisions, that their commitment is real and that there will be fruit and growth.

We are expecting an increase in the need for guides, as we continue to increase our camps to 13 for 2020. Please prayerfully consider how God can use you to help make our 2020 summer camps a success.

Our newly developing Women's Outreach Ministry will reach women with the Great Commission, bringing them the gospel of Christ through the commonality of outdoor activities. Women's Outreach Ministry will offer local adventure experiences and fellowship for among Christian believers.

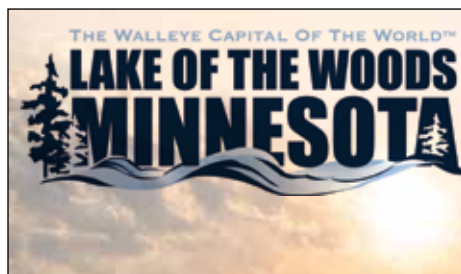
More and more women have been expressing interest to step up and volunteer at Fishing For Life events! Establishing a Women's Ministry component gives a place for connecting and getting involved with all the great programs that FFL offers.

Women's Outreach Ministry will focus foremost on developing relationships for the purpose of discipling and encouraging women in their personal faith walk. This will occur through monthly meetings of regional Women's Adventure Groups [similar in format to men's Deep C's groups].

Women's Adventure Group participants will primarily connect through activities of fishing and volunteering at fishing events. Beyond their monthly gatherings for salad/devotions/sharing, Women's Adventure Groups may set up other local outdoor activities -such as, a kayaking or canoeing trips, hiking, range gun shooting, or archery, which will be determined by local participants and set-up by that Adventure Group's co-leaders. Each Women's Adventure Group within the Twin Cities may choose a variety of outdoors activities that appeal to their own participants.

Leveraging fishing and outdoor activities as a point of common interest, Women's Adventure Group participants are Christian women that are committed to growing and living in God's Word. We give and receive encouragement to grow in faith, and become equipped to reach out to others. Adventure Group Coordinators will develop personal skills in leading others to Christ, and nurturing participants' growth.

Our future hope for Women's Outreach Ministry is that many women will connect in volunteer service at FFL's programs [such as: lake events, sports shows, fish ponds, and eventually at youth camps and NextGen mentoring programs], to share their faith and their common love of the outdoors with other women and with girls.

Vets Chasing the BIG Fish

How Muskie Mayhem Got Started.

I first volunteered for the Fishing For Life Veteran's Celebration in June of 2012. Having done the event for a few years I pitched an idea to Tom of doing a late season Muskie Fishing event in 2014. Thus, Muskie Mayhem was born. The idea of this event was that it was a means to give a novice and/or otherwise disabled angler access to essence of what makes Muskie Fishing great via live bait. As an added bonus, the event was, at least originally, scheduled to occur on Veteran's Day.

This event has always been rugged. The weather hovers on what most would consider extreme. Fishing in 40 degree water, air temps often below freezing, and as Gordon Lightfoot reminds us, the Witch of November often comes calling in the form of high winds. The payoffs though, are equally rewarding. The Vets get the opportunity to interact with and catch a fish the often exceeds 40 inches in length and is the alpha predator of its domain. The fish hunts and stalks the minnows before it devours them. It is a magnificent fusion of freshwater fishing and trophy buck hunting.

This event warms a special place in my heart. My parents divorced when I was 2 and as a result I was raised by my Grandfather, a veteran of WWII who was a medic and served in the Battle of the Bulge. Among his many lessons, was a love of fishing and the outdoors. I lost him when I was 16, but I've always been drawn to those who serve as a result of his example. This event for me is a way to honor and share his legacy as well as give back to those who voluntarily sacrifice and endure so much so the rest of us can enjoy our heritage of liberty and freedom.

One to Remember

If you did not make it to the fall retreat this year, you missed out on amazing fishing and fellowship. For me, this was a weekend I will never forget. This was my second year attending the fall retreat and decided to bring my Dad. Even though I grew up with Fishing for Life and going to Deep C's, my Dad wasn't able to get that involved. He brought me to my first Marathon Man event at the Docks of Maynard's on Minnetonka and had been to a couple of the banquets. This year has been a year of many hardships and changes for my family and knew I needed to get my Dad back into the thing that has always brought him joy.

Growing up, my best memories were spent fishing with my Dad and Grandpa for a week up at a cabin in Cass County. This is how I grew up and learned about fishing from my Dad. As I grew up and life got crazier, the less I was able to get out fishing with my Dad. This was right about the time I found Fishing for Life. The first time I saw the mobile trout pond at the Christian Community fair I knew I had to get as involved as I could. This year I have felt like I have been able to reconnect my dad to fishing and the great outdoors. Back in 2008 my Dad's boat broke down and he hasn't had one since, but for Father's Day I bought him one at our annual boat auction which has gotten him hooked once again.

As Dad and I were driving up to Mount Carmel so many memories came flooding in. We drove through the rain and wind while worshipping God and I realized this was going to be the first Christian retreat my Dad and I have been on together. I knew God was going to bless this time.

The first night was a great time of fellowship and worship. In the history of the DeepC's fall retreat no one had ever caught a Muskie and knew I had to get my Dad to be the first. That first day a lot of people stayed on Lake Carlos chain of lakes, but I knew I had to fish the rough waters of Lake Miltona, the largest lake in the region. When we got out on the water it was white caps everywhere with four foot swells.

We pounded across the lake to a promising looking area that was a little bit out of the wind. In the first fifteen minutes we saw our first Muskie. In the next hour we had six follows and two strikes, but no fish. I decided I knew this was a promising spot and headed to my second location. We started casting and in less than fifteen minutes it was fish on. My dad was casting a deep diver off the back of the boat and hooks into a Muskie. As he's fighting the fish I rush for the net and

in one quick swoop I had the fish in the net and in the boat. I was shaking! I could not believe the first fish God blesses my dad with was a twenty-seven inch Muskie. We take the measurement and picture and release the fish. We keep fishing this weed line and catch three more species to bring his score to 80 inches the first day. My Dad was in the lead, but only by six inches.

We had dinner and enjoyed Chapel together and I could feel God moving in both our hearts. Pastor Dan talked on the story of Jesus and the Demoniac and how Jesus broke every social norm just to save this one soul and how he cares personally about every soul on earth and he brings calm and

peace into a life that is otherwise full of chaos. I could see God doing this for my Dad though this weekend.

After chapel we looked at the weather and saw it was going to be the perfect night to get out on the water. We knew that if my dad was going to hold his lead he needed to up his inches through the night. So we decided we needed to get to a couple of hours of sleep in and then hit the water. We were on the water by 1:00 AM and casted for muskies under the full moon for two hours. After no luck, I knew I needed to change up and get him some inches. By 5:45am he increased his inches by twenty eight inches breaking the highest score of any fall retreat. We walked into breakfast with 108 inches.

After breakfast and chapel we headed back out to see if we could improve our score. Fishing was hard but we still caught fish. At this point it's lunch time and my back is killing me. We decided to call it a day and head in early with a grand total of 118 inches.

Saturday night most people would think my highlight would have been my dad sweeping the board with largest muskie, largest walleye, largest sunny, and most inches but they would have been wrong. That night my dad had opened up and shared part of his testimony and I was in tears. I am in tears just writing this. This was the first time I had ever heard my dad open up, especially in a group of people, and share his story. He was open and honest on where he was and I couldn't have been more proud. I want to thank everyone that came to this fall retreat and helped make it so special. I close with my life passage: "Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for He who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another-and all the more as you see the Day approaching." ~Hebrews 10:23-25
