### Reel 'Em In (REI) Program "Feed my Starving Children," but for outdoors men and women.

I would like to introduce the Reel 'Em In (REI) program to you in depth in this edition of the Jimmy Journal. If you have not helped at one of these events, you really need to give it a try!

Its like "Feed my Starving Children" but for outdoors men and women. You also might take home a great rod/reel too!

I love the REI program and its story... At the beginning of 2006 we were taking rods/reels from the Ron Schara group as they had a program called the Cast-A-Way, which was collecting old rods/reels to refurbish. Ron did not know what to do with the vast amount of collections he was getting so we volunteered to help. Ron sold the program to Gander Mountain stores and we started to work with them. They soon expanded to all 128 stores with collections and it was an overwhelming amount of stuff. It was wonderful in many ways, it also forced us to pray and purchase land/storage for the items we received. This directly led to the current 20-30 boats that are donated each year. Each year we have a large waiting list of groups nationwide looking for these refurbished rods/reels and tackle boxes, they come and pick them up and they take kids out fishing. We also ship many refurbished rods/reels nationwide so the scope of this project truly is National! The

### **One Year Done** God's Calling Sometimes Comes As An "Actual" Phone Call!

A s of June 1st, I have been working full-time for Fishing for Life (FFL) for one year. So far, I've had many excit-

ing adventures as I was able to travel across the country and even to Canada. I am truly blessed to be part of this ministry as we work towards bringing people to the kingdom of God through the great outdoors.

This summer is turning out to be another busy time with camps, lake events, trout ponds, Reel Em' In(REI) events and the garage sale, I wouldn't want to spend it any other way! I am very excited to be able to use my schooling as I will be leading and planning trips to the Boundry Waters Canoe Area (BWCA) and Superior Hiking Trail (SHT) trip for two of our camps this summer.

Some of you may not know my story of how I came to be an employee of FFL, so here it is...

I first came in contact with FFL on November 13th at the St. Paul River Centre. My Mom, Grandma and I were attending the Christian Community Fair. As we arrive the first thing I see is the trout pond. I was so excited, because I've always loved fishing. I pay my \$3 and start fishing, after a few minutes I catch my two fish and was done. I was thinking, "how can I stay and fish more?," I notice the guy running the pond, Chris Armstrong, was the only person there and was running around like a chicken with its head cut off trying to take money and get fish off lines for kids. I ask Chris, "Hey, do you want some help taking fish off for kids?" and he excitingly says "That would be great! My volunteers haven't showed up yet!"

So for the next couple hours I helped take trout off until the volunteers showed up. I took all the Fishing for Life(FFL) info to see what other fishing opportunities I'd be able to help with.

The following Monday, I gave Tom Goodrich a call and told him that I was a 15 year old boy that loves fishing and that I helped out at the trout pond and wanted to start volunteering. Tom asks me if I know how to make pinatas and I said yeah my sisters have had to do them for school. So the first task he sets me up to do is make 15 fishing pinatas for their upcoming Fish Fair up at the Anoka County Fair grounds. I made the pinatas and helped out with the fish fair that whole weekend.

I made a bunch of new friends and was even more excited to volunteer. The next thing Tom has me do is help out with a lake event that just so happened to be in my home town. At this time Tom introduced me to Jeff Wynne who was going to be running their mobile trout ponds through the summer and the first one was at Hastings River town days. That whole summer Jeff and I ran the trout pond across Minnesota. Next thing I knew, I was volunteering every chance I got... I did all the sport shows and even helped Jeff feed the homeless in Minneapolis. At this time God was really working in me. Then at the ice fishing show I met Dave Lindmark, he had a ministry called GEM. Dave asked me to be a junior boat guide and I spent that whole next summer guiding for the camps. This was exactly where I needed to be as I could use passion for teaching people how to fish.

Time goes by, I keep volunteering, but I needed to start thinking about what to do for college. I had my heart set on going post-secondary my senior year full-time with the end goal of working in the outdoors and having something too do with fishing. My parents and I went up to Ely, MN to check out Vermillion Community College as they support the post-secondary programs and I would have a chance to do full time up there and live on campus. In talking with some Outdoor Leadership students, I found out that I could make a career out of leading people in the outdoors. I knew instantly it was what I wanted to do.

After I got accepted I signed up for classes and found out that students have an opportunity to live on campus in the summer for cheap. I decided to apply for a job at the Voyageur North Outfitter near the college. I filled out the application, brought it back and got an interview with the manager who said I'd most likely have the job but he just has to run it by the owners, John and Lynn O'Kane. He said they were currently down at the Northwest Sportsman show running a booth. I decided to head to the show and talk with John. After talking with John, I was told I had the job. So, I moved up there the day I graduated 11th grade.

I spent a few years up in Ely and then in 2015 I moved back home to help my dad and mom out and got a full-time job at ReConserve of Minnesota. A few years later, I ended up rupturing my L5, L4, and S1 discs in my back and was out of work for almost 10 months.

The day I got cleared to go back to work, I got a call for a job interview. I did the interview, came back home, and My mom asked, how the interview went. I replied "Great! I think I'll get the job!" As soon as I say those words my phone starts ringing, I look and its Tom Goodrich. I picked up the phone and we talk for about 45 minutes. Tom was checking on how I was doing, and at the end of the call he says, "the main reason I'm calling is to see if you would be interested in a full-time paid position with Fishing for Life. I don't know all the details yet, but pray about it and get back to me."

I didn't know what to say, but I instantly knew this was where God was calling me to be. So I give it a few hours, call him back ended up leaving a message. An hour later he shoots me a text saying "I'm turkey hunting in Hastings in the morning, meet me at Kwik Trip at 4:30am." So we go out hunting and have the job interview in a turkey blind. The rest is history!

He was known as the guy with the stringer full of walleyes in his boat. Also his boat look like a porcupine with with gapa poles on Lake Mille Lage

all the kids fishing with cane poles on Lake Mille Lacs.

In 2000 I was asked by my church to take kids fishing as part of their "Hooka-Fish" ministers, a ministry my father prepared me for. I had forgotten how much fun it was to take kids out in the boat. I will never stop loving God for giving me that joy.

In 2010 I was asked to be the start-up director of a new bass circuit as a spin off of the Fishers of Men National Tournament, where this would be called Fishers of Men National Tournament Trail/Legacy for an adult and a junior (18 or younger). God and I were able to grow this series to set national attendance records in the US and heaven. Legacy and my team were bring 25 teens to Christ per year. Legacy would come over and help Fishing for Life weigh fish in the early days. Legacy was the first to have a special needs fishing tournament at Camp Friendship. Due my wife's poor health I stepped down after 8 years, but left it in good hands.

Aug 31, 2015 my son Shane passed while working as a firemen/paramedic in St. Paul. The bottom fell out of my christian life. The loss rocked me. I went into shut-down for 3 years. Had no energy or desire to fish or do anything. In the mean time my wife had me take her daycare kids fishing. The joy was lost.

I sat on the couch most of the time. Then God started nudging me. It was relentless. I had no peace. God bugged me! I had trouble sleeping, it was in my dreams. This is hard to explain in words. I just knew that God wanted me to call Tom Goodrich. I did not want to call him but I did call Tom. The bugging stop and peace returned. Joy of fishing with special needs kids returned. I new God had something special for me. And sure enough on July 13, Party on the Beebe will happen. Amen

After an interview by Jim and the FFL staff, selections will be made to help each youth match up with a trained NextGEN Guide. Boys are matched with a man, girls with a woman. All guides are vetted, trained, and very experienced at Fishing



for Life programming. The adult will become a friend, mentor, and fishing related guide for many FFL outings over the next year.

This *NEW* NextGEN Program within Fishing for Life is focused on providing intentional, consistent & measurable one-on-one outdoor experiences and Christ centered guidance to these youth. Consistent with the FFL mission statement, this program will continue to provide sound Christian leadership and young manhood or womanhood character building support during all Fishing for Life activities

Within this Vet's Kid Program I am also seeking volunteer men and women who would become NextGEN Guides. They do not have to be veterans. But, they should see this as a very meaningful MISSIONS opportunity right here in Minnesota! The guide's love for fishing and the outdoors is important along with their desire to mentor the Vet's Kid they are matched up with though out the year on selected FFL outings and events. All the programming, materials, and a unique outing Guide Log Book provide a new experience for any adult man or women who have may been with FFL for years as outing volunteers, and now could "step up" into a more focused mentoring role for a very specific veteran related kid relationship. What in the world is EOS? And Why is Fishing for Life Using It?

Entrepreneurial Operating System (EOS), is a complete set of simple concepts and practical tools that has helped thousands of entrepreneurs get what they want from their businesses. By following the simple operating techniques, leadership teams of growth-oriented companies systematically and permanently improve. So why is Fishing for Life (FFL) using this tool? Aren't we a non-profit within the ministry world?

Eventhough FFL is a non-profit and ministry, many of the tools from the EOS are able to help us to realize our short comings and help form and reach currrent and future goals.

In the spring of 2018, the team met for a two-day retreat to begin the process of setting goals for Fishing for Life and began the journey down the EOS road. Tom and the board, decided to use the book, "Traction" to help bring FFL to the next level of performance. Michael Stillwell, a board member, and his dad Brian had already been using this tool within their own business at Patriot Converting and finding that time after time, it was helping them to move farther within their buisness.

It's now one year later and we are seeing many of goals being met. These include developing ministry specifically for women, increasing the giving and impact of current ministries, specific skilled hires to work in areas of need, and a database software program to manage day-to-day business. Each of these goals resulted from the EOS retreat last year.

On April 12<sup>th</sup>, 2019, staff and board members met again for a one day retreat to review the EOS plan, and left with a refreshed vision. New goals have been set, new challenges have begun. As part of that bigger plan, it is with great joy that I have become a part of this team. My role, working behind the scenes, is to connect the team with tools to enhance staff progress and success. Reviewing processes and introducing new ideas have been a few of the ways I have been involved. The banquet was a huge part of my spring work load, but concurrently I have been working to get my arms around SalesForce and slowly introduce each event from FFL into the database, as well as OneCause fundraising software.

During prayer time at one of our meetings I shared my difficulties with Salesforce. Within the week an amazing lady from New Jersey was assigned to be my many Sales-Force coach. She has taken me under her wing and is now using her pro-bono hours to help me get our site established and the infrastructure set properly. Let me tell you, having her in my corner and knowing that God placed her in my path has been a huge blessing. Fishing for Life has also set down some roots and we now have a small office, conference table and even a few desks!

For everyone out there who is asking God to lead them into ministry or a deeper meaning in life, I want to encourage you to keep asking God. He hears you – and He will honor your desire. Remember, God is the one who put that desire in your heart to begin with! Each one of us at Fishing for Life have similar stories of how God is working through FFL to bless it's staff and the many thousands of people we serve each year! The specific ways we see God at work is fun to talk about, remember together, and of course we Praise Him for this gift.
