### Fishing Tips – Quick Fix for Broken Rods

Chances are you have a broken fishing rod from last season that is just waiting for some attention! I have one from last summer when I was fishing with my grand nephew. Somehow it got stepped on and it broke.



Stuff like that happens but here are a couple of quick fixes that while not perfect will get you going again. The

same techniques work on broken handles too. Don't ask how I know <:-).

### **Rod Tip Repair**

If the rod is broken very near the tip (within the last 1-8") you can simply cut the end clean and move the tip guide from the broken off end to the rod. You will lose a few inches of rod length but it will function fine.

To do this you will need a lighter of some sort, a pair of pliers and a hot melt glue stick. You can also buy rod tip glue from any major sports seller but hot melt glue works fine too.

Stabilize the rod somehow or have someone else hold it. Heat the base of the top guide for 5-10 seconds with the lighter while tugging on it with pliers. When the hot melt glue softens you should be able to easily pull it right off.

Clean the end of the rod where it was broken, cutting it back a little bit if necessary so that it will cleanly fit into the rod tip. Heat the end of the rod for a few seconds and roll it around on the glue stick until the last 3/8" to  $\frac{1}{2}$ " of the rod has a thin coating of glue on it.

Heat up the tip of the rod with the lighter until the glue melts and flows nicely. Slide the tip onto the rod, making sure that the tip is in line with the rest of the guides. A minute later and you are good to go!

### **Rod Repair**

If the rod is broken 3 or 4 guides down and you would rather not have a rod that is 2 or 3 feet shorter, consider this option: This procedure basically involves inserting and gluing a carbon fiber rod into each rod end connecting the two halves together. Testing this final rod repair with weights showed almost no impairment to the action! Cut each end clean. A Dremel tool with a high speed cut off wheel is great for this. A table saw with a 40 tooth carbide blade or



a plywood blade works great too.



Now head off to the hobby store and pick up some carbon fiber rod. Hopefully you can find one that just smoothly slides into **both** ends. Pick up some epoxy and shrink wrap tubing

while you are at it. My favorite epoxy is Locktite Marine waterproof epoxy with a 3 hour set time.

Stabilize the rod by taping it down to a workplace and slide a 2-3" piece of shrink wrap tubing onto the rod. Spread a little of the epoxy on half of a 4-6" piece of



the new carbon fiber rod. Insert the glued end into the end of the fishing rod. Coat the other

half of the carbon fiber rod with epoxy and slide it into the other broken piece making sure you don't push the first end into the rod any further.

Note: Make sure the guide tip lines up with the rest of the guides before the epoxy sets! Clean off the extra

epoxy where the rods meet. Use the left over carbon fiber rod to help line up the guides too. A little tape over the joint will stabilize it until the epoxy has set.

Leave it until the epoxy has set and slide the shrink wrap tubing up over the joint and heat shrink it.

Instead of using heat shrink tubing you can use thread to wrap the joint for about a half an inch on either

side and seal it with epoxy but that procedure, while perhaps better, is somewhat more time consuming and detailed.

(Excellent with Northern Pike too)

Cut walleye or northern pike fillets into 1 inch squares. Wrap with bacon and fasten with toothpicks. Coat with your favorite BBQ sauce and grill for 10-15 minutes or until bacon is crispy. Re-glaze with BBQ sauce every few minutes while grilling.

Alternate broiling procedure: place "bites" on a foil-lined cookie sheet and broil in oven for 20 minutes or until bacon crisps.


