

Pro Fishing Tips Sept 2020 by Dwight Nelson

Originally this column was going to be on salmon fishing along the North Shore of Lake Superior. September and October can be red hot months for salmon fishing on our great North Shore. Because of the interest in Lake Carlos with the retreat coming up, we will focus on Lake Carlos and surrounding lakes this month and



then focus on salmon fishing in the October column.

Background

Lake Carlos is a 2605 acre lake that is part of the Alexandria chain of lakes. It has a maximum depth of 163 feet and forms the headwaters of the Long Prairie River. In spite of significant development on the lake, it has low nutrient and pollution loading. This is the result of being downstream from several other lakes which tend to filter the water before it gets to Lake Carlos. Low phosphorus levels also result in lower algae growth. Thus the lake is able to support both emergent and submerged vegetation.

Diminished nutrients also mean slower growth rate for curly leaf pondweed which has been established in the lake. Note too that zebra mussels which also

have been found in the lake may contribute to the great water clarity. Secchi disk readings of over 20 feet have been recorded with a weedline at 20-25'.




Right: United Scientific secchi disc with 72' of line used for recording water clarity.

While Carlos is viewed as a bass-panfish lake, northern pike and large walleye (fewer in number) are present. The deep cold water areas support large schools of Cisco.

Preliminary data from a sampling by the DNR this past July (2020) indicate the following (mean wt, mean length): walleye (2.7#, 18.7"), Northern Pike (2.0#, 20.8"), Largemouth Bass (0.9#, 11.7"), Smallmouth bass (2.1#, 15.7"). You may also find Redhorse (mean 2#), Dogfish (mean 4 ½#), sucker (mean 2#) as well as other panfish and river type fish. (Do Dogfish really bark when caught?)

Fishing Lake Carlos

When fishing a lake in the fall always consider the thermocline, if there is one. In Lake Carlos, since the water is so clear, the thermocline, if it is there could be anywhere from 30-45' down. Oxygen levels in Lake Carlos are good enough to support fish all the way down to 50'.



You can see from the graph above that while the July 13 temperature dropped off markedly below 20' deep, the oxygen level stayed well above that needed for fish to 50'. By October, the O_2 levels at 45-60' will have dropped to close to 2 ppm – not enough for most fish (MNPCA).

Find the bulrushes on the north end of Carlos for some good fishing. Smallmouth like smaller baits so try jigs, inline spinners; anything that looks like a crayfish in neutral colors. Plop frog baits right on the lily pads if you find them and toss senko rigged baits and worms right under those docks. I also like using Zara Spooks, Norman D22s and twitching jerk baits like Rapala's Husky Jerk.

If you decide to go deep consider this. Last summer, John Figi won the Champions Tour Bass tourney on Carlos in June (at Mt Carmel) by fishing and staying on schools of LM bass in 14-20' of water. He got all 68 fish (116#) by using drop shots and jig worms. What works the weekend of the retreat will all depend on *temperature* and the *wind*!

July 1st of this year Tim Olson was trolling cranks at 30' in 110 FOW (Feet Of Water) for walleye when a 24" Rainbow trout hit his crank. This is very unusual for Lake Carlos and a bit of a mystery but some stocking was done decades ago. Read on if you are bent on walleye fishing.

Troll the middle if you dare for Cisco and possibly walleye that are waiting to ambush them. The Cisco will be traveling in large schools you should see on sonar. Go no further than 300-400 yards off the dock to 120 FOW and look for them 50-60' down. I'll send the first person to catch a Cisco a Rapala lure if you email me a picture.

Other Lakes

With a half a dozen lakes you can navigate to, you have a number of options. Trailer up and go to Miltona too for a shot at muskies (10% are over 50") and walleye. In the clear water you might have to consider night fishing. Running out of space. Good luck.

FRIED FROG'S LEGS RECIPE

For all those of you out there that have always wondered how to prepare frog legs here is simple recipe for delicious frog's legs that are breaded with cracker crumbs and cornmeal, then fried in oil.

Ingredients

- 24 each frog's legs, skin removed
- 1 (4 ounce) packet saltine crackers, crushed
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- ½ cup cornmeal
- 1 teaspoon minced onion
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 tablespoon ground black pepper
- 2 large eggs
- ½ cup milk
- 2 cups vegetable oil for frying
- 1 cup peanut oil for frying

Preparation

 Rinse the frog's legs and pat dry; set aside. In a large resealable bag, combine the saltine cracker crumbs, flour, cornmeal, onion, salt and pepper. Shake to mix. In a shallow bowl, whisk together eggs and milk.



- 2. Heat the vegetable oil and peanut oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. The oil should be about 1/2 inch deep.
- 3. Dip the frog's legs into the milk and egg, then dip into the cracker mixture until evenly coated. Carefully place them in the hot oil. Cook until golden brown on each side, about 5 minutes per side. If the legs start to brown too quickly, reduce the heat to medium. Drain on paper towels before serving.


