Our Theme Verse for 2021 is Luke 5:4, when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch."

The command of Jesus to Simon, "LAUNCH OUT". Simon is a very experienced fisherman. He had just tried during the best fishing hour to catch fish but was unsuccessful. Going fishing at that time was contrary to Peter's good judgment as an experienced fisherman. There were several reasons not to go out, he was discouraged because of his lack of success he just had, he was ready to hang it up for the day, try another time, the best time for fishing over, if in the best time caught nothing, how foolish to try now, he was probably also weary. Up all night, casting out nets and rowing.

Peter's obedience, "Nevertheless, at Thy Word I will let down the net. Peter was probably thinking I have been doing this all night, once more will not hurt me. He could have also been thinking about how often he had quit, discouraged one net short of filling the boat.

In the same area where he drew up empty nets, the nets are now full. So full they begin to break. What is the secret? Obedience! Doing God's will may not always produce phenomenal results. God calls some to plant. Others to water. We should never measure success by numbers, but by obedience.

Ask yourself these questions and remember Peter could have said no. Am I doing what God wants me to do? Am I doing all God wants me to do?

Pro Fishing Tips Jan 2021 by Dwight Nelson

Greetings everyone! Happy New Year to all of you. Thank you for being a part of Fishing for Life and a personal note of thanks for those of you I have had the pleasure of getting to know better and fishing with in 2020.



Year in Review


2020 certainly was a strange year wasn't it?! I was iust finishing up teaching a class on the "Origins of the Bible" at a church in Eden Prairie, MN when Covid-19 reared its ugly head. We managed to finish the class but then by April no one knew if we would even be able to get on the water for opener. Luckily we were able to get out for spring fishing but we were never quite sure how it was going to work out.

I kept the boat on the water longer this past year than ever before ending "summer" fishing on, you guessed it, the Mississippi River by the Red Wing dam on Dec. 22. My reward was catching 5 sauger with the largest being a fat 17" (I kept 4 with the new limits).

Each time I go fishing I learn something new, no matter where I go. I later record what I learned. Consider keeping a log or a journal on your phone or laptop with the techniques you tried, location, bait, weather, results, etc. I have been doing that for a few vears now so in the future I can review what worked.

For the log book this past trip out I added a few comments. I started out fishing on one side of the river with plastics. I have had luck with Bfishn Tackle Pulse-R paddletails so I started with them. After 2 hours of using plastics I

decided I had to do something very different.



New Year's Resolutions?

Do you have any New Year's Resolutions? Or, as a friend says "New Year's Intentions?" For me one was to get the boat into storage and that is already done now. Another I could suggest is to **try trout fishing** on several of our area lakes for inland trout.

The season starts January 16 – just a few days away. You can "sight fish" in 3-10 feet of water (start half way down) using typical crappie baits. It is one of the most fun (and frustrating) forms of fishing I know.

Another New Year intention might be to focus on learning a new lake in 2021 or to learn a few new techniques. Neko rigs and drop-shot rigs have lots of potential. The new "Tokyo rig" looks really cool too. And remember for next year, be careful telling fishing stories to someone who has a better memory than you do! Above all, remember in 2021 to give thanks to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ for the opportunity we have to fish and hunt in His great world. Tell Him every time out and start your adventures in prayer.

Tungsten Jigs

You may already be using tungsten jigs or plan to try them this year ice fishing. Here are some things you may want to know about them. In many situations they work really well. Since they are (usually) denser than lead, they get down in the water column faster than lead jigs of the same size. A denser jig can give some interesting action to your presentation too.

Tungsten melts at 6,192° F and has a density 70% greater than lead (hence a tungsten jig will be heavier than the same size lead jig). Obviously tungsten cannot be melted into aluminum or steel molds which melt at considerably less temperature. Instead, powdered tungsten is typically mixed with 2% nickel and 1% iron and bonded together under high pressure in molds yielding a jig that is 97% tungsten.

A slot at the top is used for soldering hooks in. That is why on many tungsten jigs the hook seems close to the top.

Another way to make them is to mix epoxy glue with the tungsten powder but then the density goes down and the resulting jig is not much better than a lead jig. Watch out for these. Have fun if you try them.

Venison Jerky



Ingredients

- 1-pound boneless venison roast
- 4 tablespoons soy sauce
- 4 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 2 tablespoons liquid smoke flavoring
- 1 tablespoon ketchup
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/4 teaspoon onion salt
- ½ teaspoon salt

Slice meat into long strips, 1 inch wide and 1/8 inch thick. In a large releasable plastic bag, combine soy sauce, Worcestershire sauce, liquid smoke, ketchup, pepper, garlic powder, onion salt and salt. Place meat in, and close bag. Refrigerate overnight. Knead occasionally, to evenly distribute marinade.

Preheat oven to 160 degrees F (70 degrees C). Place a pan on the bottom of oven to catch drips, or line with aluminum foil.

Place meat strips on a rack so that they do not touch each other and dehydrate for 6 to 8 hours in the oven, or until desired consistency is achieved.


