

Hello everyone I hope February was good to you and you enjoyed the Holes 4 Heroes event I definitely did! This month we continue our study session of looking at more inspiring people such as fishermen, maybe athletes or even public figures. This month I have a fishermen for you - lets dive into Rick Clunn. According to Wikipedia Rick



Clunn was born July 24th of 1946 he's a professional fishermen who won the Bassmaster Classic Tournament four times 1976 1977 1984 and again in 1990. He's tied with Kevin Van Dam for the most Bassmaster Classic wins.



They consider Rick

Clunn as one of the best anglers of all time placing in the top ten in over 100 tournaments. He won 17 of those in 1988 and he was named angler of the year by the BASS organization in 2001 he was inducted into the Bass Fishing Hall of Fame. On February 12th of 2019 Clunn beat his own record as the oldest angler to win a Bassmaster Elite Series event he was 72 years old. On the final day of competing on the St. Johns River Clunn caught two Largemouths both 9 plus pounds to solidify his win. So simply put Rick Clunn is one of the best in the sport of fishing. 
Fishing For Life, founded in 2004, is a tax exempt charitable organization whose mission is to inspire a love of fishing and outdoor activities through Christ-centered programming.

Pro Fishing Tips March 2021

NOP

No I did not mean Nope. NOP is the DNR acronym for Northern Pike. It seems February was the month for pike – big pike.



At the Holes for Heroes event on Medicine Lake, Chris Ray pulled in this nice 29" northern pike. We



thought that would be big enough to win the prize but someone pulled in a 30 at the south end of the lake!

A week later I was with friends on the south end of the lake and we pulled 27" range (from the same hole no less). I filleted one of the northerns (with nose clips on – it didn't smell all that

good!). But wow did it taste good grilled. My little secret: I baste northern and walleye fillets in butter, then sprinkle Lawry's Seasoning Salt on them, then grill them at 400-450F.

Then, at the winter retreat Steve Cruikshank got the very nice northern pictured in his column. Ice season is over for Northern Pike now, but keep it in mind for next ice season. We have some great NOP lakes close by.

Open Season

So what season is open right now? My wife says "It is always open season for something." She's right. Inland trout fishing is still open (until March 31) and can be fun for getting kids on the ice, as we did yesterday. While the kids we took out yesterday didn't catch any trout, they saw some swim by on the camera and had fun catching sunnies. It was a great day to be on the water.

Crappies are still open and come end of April, beginning of May, some dandies can be found. If you get an urge to get the boat out, remember that walleye season is continuous on Ole Miss (eg. Pool 4).

Reminder!

Please remember that our fishing licenses expired at the end of February so if you have not done so please get your new fishing license sooner than later. Also keep in mind that the DNR has changed the process for "spouse" fishing licenses. Your spouse will now have to be present in person to get the blue plastic license. You can get a paper copy by creating a separate account for your spouse online, but frankly that process is a little bit messed up right now.

Finding Lakes

With summer fishing seasons coming up soon, you may want to take some time to find a new lake to explore. The best way I have found to do this is by using the DNR Lake Finder. For several thousand fishable lakes in Minnesota the DNR has created a vast amount of data that can be explored. See https:// www.dnr.state.mn.us/lakefind/index.html.

The DNR Lake Finder has contour maps and fisheries in 2 northerns in the surveys for most lakes in the database. You can find lakes that have for instance high walleye catch rates (High CPUE) or the average length of pike and perch. Some of the reports are older while a lot are newer; most have great information.



Speaking of the DNR, our Minnesota DNR employs dozens of trained Law Enforcement Officers (LEO) specially trained as Conservation Officers (formerly called Game Wardens). They put their lives on the line every day in the protection of our waters and forests.

A friend of mine, Jeff Halvorson, never wanted to be a LEO. In fact, if he hadn't become a Game Warden, he would have become an elementary school teacher. He brought those skills with him to the DNR and over the years in the Brainerd lakes area has fostered education and married that with enforcement. One day, he showed up with a sidearm, an AR in the front seat and a shotgun in back, wearing camo. He was on an unpleasant mission – investigating poaching on the lake I was fishing on. He does not like surveillance but it came with the job. So next time you run into a CO, keep in mind they all have a tough job. Minnesota has lost some great COs in the line of duty.

PHEASANT POT PIE



<u>Ingredients</u>

2 pheasants (2-1/2 pounds each)

4 cups water

1 medium onion, quartered.

1 garlic clove, minced.

2 tablespoons lemon juice

1-1/4 teaspoons salt

1/2 teaspoon pepper

1/4 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg

3/4 cup all-purpose flour

1 jar (16 ounces) pearl onions, drained.

1 package (10 ounces) frozen peas

1-1/2 cups sliced carrots

1 jar (2 ounces) sliced pimientos, drained

1/4 cup minced fresh parsley

Pastry for single-crust pie

Directions

In a large saucepan, place the pheasants, water, quartered onion, celery and garlic; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 1 hour or until tender.

When cool enough to handle, remove meat from bones; discard bones. Cut meat into bite-sized pieces; set aside. Strain broth, discarding vegetables. Measure 3-1/2 cups broth and place in saucepan. Add the lemon juice, salt, pepper, Worcestershire sauce and nutmeg. Remove 1/2 cup and stir in flour. Bring broth in saucepan to a boil. Add flour mixture; boil 1 minute or until thickened and bubbly.

Add the pearl onions, peas, carrots, pimientos, parsley and pheasant. Spoon into a 2-1/2-qt. baking dish. Roll pastry to fit dish; place over meat mixture and seal edges to dish. Cut small steam vents in crust. Bake at 425° for 35-40 minutes or until bubbly and golden.


