#### WILD GAME COTTAGE PIE



#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 lb ground bison
- 1/2 lb elk steak, minced / thinly sliced
- 2 tbsp unsalted butter
- 3 tbsp olive oil, extra virgin
- 8 oz mushrooms, sliced
- 1 white onion, finely chopped
- 1 shallot, finely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 cup zucchini, finely chopped
- 2 tbsp flour
- 2 tbsp tomato paste1 1/2 cups beef broth
- 1 cup red wine, cabernet or merlot
- 1 tsp sea salt
- 1 tsp granulated garlic powder
- 1 bay leaf

#### **CAULIFLOWER TOPPING**

- 1 head cauliflower coarsely chopped
- 4 tbsp unsalted butter
- 1 tsp sea salt
- 1/2 cup parmesan cheese, grated
- 1 tsp dried parsley
- 2 green onions, finely chopped

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- Heat a skillet over medium heat and add 1 tablespoon of olive oil. Carefully add the cubed meat to the skillet frying until lightly browned on the edges. Add the ground game and continue cooking until done. Remove from heat.
- 2. Heat a large saucepan over medium heat and add butter and 2 tablespoons of olive oil. Toss in the mush-rooms, onions, shallots, zucchini, and garlic cooking until the onions soften about 15 minutes.
- 3. Sprinkle flour over the vegetables and stir to coat. Whisk in the beef broth, tomato paste and red wine and cook for a few minutes. Add the browned game meat to the saucepan and season with salt and garlic powder. Add a bay leaf and reduce the heat simmering for 45 minutes or until the gravy thickens.
- 4. Cook cauliflower florets in a large saucepan of boiling water for 15 minutes or until tender. Remove from pan and drain. Add the cauliflower back into the pan and puree with an immersion blender or potato masher. Add butter and season with salt. Cover with a lid to keep cauliflower mash warm.
- 5. Pre-heat the oven to 400 degrees.
- 6. Pour the meat into an oven proof dish or pie pan and top with the cauliflower mash. Season the mash with Parmesan cheese and dried parsley flakes. (I also like to drizzle a little extra virgin olive oil on top). Bake for 25-30 minutes or until the topping is golden browned.
- 7. Garnish with chopped green onions and serve immediately.

(NOTE: This Wild Game Cottage Pie recipe will work well with any substitution of ground game meat including elk, antelope, venison, and bighorn sheep. You can use 1 1/2 pounds of all ground game meat if you prefer.)

Then search for "FFL Deep C's Total Inched Tournament." Then enter the tournament. The cost is \$30. All monies received will be paid out in cash prizes. 1st place receives 50% 2nd place receives 30% and 3rd place receives 20%. There will also be prizes for the largest fish of each species. This is a total inches' tournament so you can enter as many fish as you want but only your biggest one of each species will be recorded together in the total inches' tournament. The species are Walleye, Northern, Muskie, LM Bass. SM Bass, Crappie, Sunfish, Perch. The tournament started on May 1st and will go through the Fall Retreat ending on September 19th. 

### Pro Fishing Tips August 2021


Hello August! If it's not Covid or the record heat of June and July, now we have forest fires and smoke to deal with. I am thankful today that my grandson's first trip to the BWCAW turned out well and he is still excited about back-



packing. Guess who he will be asking to go with him next time?!

I have a couple of simple reminders for you this month. They kind of go without saying but I guess we all need to be reminded once in awhile.

- 1) If you are planning on using bait, use fresh bait and make sure they are still alive! I brought some leeches with last trip out and they stunk by the time I got on the water. That didn't work so good. I decided to use the crawlers I had brought and found out they must have been left out of the fridge. You probably know what they looked like. So I went with crankbaits!
- 2) "If they're not there, they're not there." In talking to and keeping an eye on some pro guides who get out every day, I've come to realize that I spend too much time in the same spot looking for fish. The key I think is to move around and to move often enough to check a number of new/old areas in the same trip out.
- 3) A friend says (of fishing for walleye): "If you're not on the bottom you're not catching fish". That's probably true most of the year except right now. Walleyes are spread out and all up and down the water column as are crappies.
- 4) Watch the thermocline and fish just above it. Pictured here is the thermocline I saw last week (end of July).




If you want to fish the bottom (or the thermocline) you need to know if your lure is on the bottom or where it is. This time of year you can cover a lot of water by pulling crankbaits. While I have come to appreciate jigging and pulling lindy rigs around, there is nothing

like sitting back and trolling a crankbait 100' back.

There are two ways to determine how deep your crankbait is reaching. The first method is simply to let out line until you can feel your crankbait ticking the bottom. Either leave it there or reel in some line to make the lure run just off the bottom.

The second method involves looking up the crankbait on a "dive curve" or depth curve. It is very important to realize that the numbers published on lure packaging are only guides for a certain length of line out from the boat (and for a specific line. Braid will almost always allow a lure to run deeper). Almost every crankbait will run deeper with more line out but will not change depth with the speed of the boat.



Shown here is the depth the excellent Berkley Flicker Shad 7 will run at a specified length of line out (feet back). At 35' of mono out, this lure will run 7' deep (8' with braid). With 115' of mono out it will run 13' deep (14' with braid).

Another interesting example is the Rapala DT- series. While the DT-10 is suppose to "Dive To" 10 feet, it runs 10' with 20' of line out but runs 20' deep with 100' of line out! Many if not most lures have a similar "dive curve". To take the guess work out, Precision Trolling made an app that tells you the details for your situation and crankbait. The app has hundreds of lures and is updated as new ones come out. Thanks to Mark Romanack of Precision Trolling Data for allowing me to print the above example. I hope this helps explain what your lure is doing back there and where it is!


