A Ride With Leo

Making A Wish Come True

Recently I had a chance to make one little boy's wish come true. That boy's name is Leo, and he is on his end-of-life journey. Leo is 6 years old and suffers from shaken baby syndrome. Leo suffers from a multitude of ailments, including recently losing his ability to speak and is confined to a wheelchair.

When Leo's adopted mom contacted me through a Facebook friend and told me what Leo's wish was, I said "LET'S GO". We picked a beautiful day the sun was shining, and the water was flat and calm. I am betting you figured out what Leo's wish was, right? You guessed it a boat ride.

We met at Maxwell's boat landing and loaded Leo and his mom into my boat. I took out one of the seats and Leo's wheelchair fit right in the same spot. Leo's mom got to sit right next to him. As we pushed off from the dock, I said a short prayer and we were off. As we motored across the lake Leo was sitting right in front of me and I got to see first-hand the joy of a little boy getting to fulfill a dream. It still brings tears to my eyes as I write this now. What a small thing to want to go on a boat ride, but not for Leo, it was a big deal. Leo likes any kind of motion. The more I turned the boat the happier he was. I drove that boat like a drunken sailor and Leo had a blast. I am not sure which one of us had more fun.

We stopped for lunch at Lord Fletcher's. I got a chance to get to know Leo's mom. She adopted Leo when he was 2 years old. The doctors told her that Leo should grow up and live a healthy life with some limitations. As it turns out Leo suffered more brain damage from being shaken as a baby than the doctors had originally thought. Leo's brain is not growing as fast as his body, so his organs are shutting down. Leo's brain is


not strong enough to support his fast-paced growth.

We went back out on the water after lunch and did a little fishing. I found a spot where the sun fish were still on the beds and quickly caught one. Leo got very excited to see the fish and wanted to touch it. As Leo was petting the fish, I asked him if he wanted to kiss the fish and he stuck out his tongue to give the fish a kiss. I caught several fish that afternoon and Leo wanted to touch and kiss everyone.

As we headed back to the landing (I took the long way) I did not want this day to end. Never have I had so much fun on a boat ride and I have been on a lot of boat rides. It is hard to believe, something I take for granted, like a boat ride could bring so much joy to a little boy. I will never forget that day and now every time I get into my boat I think of Leo.

We had some very warm, humid and smokey weather conditions to deal with, but overall campers liked the fishing and camp experiences. The meals were very healthy and plentiful. Thursday night was fish fry night. Very yummy.

Fishing summary: No Crappies or Muskies were caught. Largest Fish Caught: 9" Sunfish, 16 LM Bass, 20" SM Bass, 13" Rock Bass, 11" Perch, 26" Walleye and a 28" Pike. The most inches caught by one camper was: 115" inches. Total inches caught by all campers: 705 inches.

God blessed each camper and each guide with safety as they fished and traveled to and from all locations. It was a great time for food, fishing and fellowship.

So on Saturday, Robert, again, joined me in my boat with another camper. We drove to our first spot and the two of them started casting, and I dropped a sucker out the back. Robert had first dibs if the sucker rod went off. After maybe 15 minutes of fishing, I looked back at the sucker and saw a large silhouette behind it. I alerted the kids and they started freaking out (quietly of course).

The stalking muskie finally grabbed the sucker after following it for quite a distance. Once it started swimming away from us, Robert picked up the rod and set

On May 18th, the Camp Guide Training kicked off our summer fish camps. There were 33 present! On May 24th, we held our CPR/First Aid Training, and then on June 1st-3rd, a few of us attended a Water Wilderness Survival Course at Camp Amnicon in Lakeside, WI. These trainings helped to prepare us for the 12 summer camps.

The theme for this summer was taken from Luke 5:4-6 "And when He had finished speaking, He said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch,'" as we discussed God's sovereignty and man's responsibility. We are thankful that God was sovereign and that a total of 87 men and women served our 300 campers and Jr. Guides! We appreciate all the camps that hosted our groups, as well as all of the individuals that volunteered their time and fishing knowledge to make the summer camps a success. Over nine species of fish were caught, but the most common were Crappie, LM Bass, Muskie, Northern, Perch, Rock Bass, SM Bass, Sunfish, and Walleye. A highlight for this summer was when one week, a camper won the fishing tournament with 115 total inches (only the measurement of the largest species of each fish caught are recorded), which set a new High C's Camp Champ record dating back to 2013 when we first started recording in this way. Another highlight this summer was when a camper caught the largest fish ever recorded as a High C's Camp Champ, a Muskie, measuring in at 47.5 inches! The campers enjoyed the competition and the rewards at the end of the week. Thank you to the many donors for all the wonderful prizes and to the volunteers for making all of this possible so that these campers could enjoy an amazing experience.

We ended the summer with the blessing of 100 donated Twins tickets that we were able to distribute to our faithful volunteers and their families. The Twins won their game against the Blue Jays 3-1. We also had a boat launch that weekend on Mille Lacs Lake where there was good fellowship and several fish caught.

As "the camp that goes home with the kid", many times we have campers from our summer camps attend one or more of our monthly events. We had a total of 163 campers this Summer.

Please prayerfully consider how God can use you to help make our 2022 camps a success. The theme for next year will be taken from Mark 1:35 "And rising very early in the morning, while it was still dark, (Jesus) departed and went out to a desolate place, and there He prayed." We will be teaching the campers about evidences of God's grace in their lives, helping them to recognize those "holy" moments by ridding themselves of distractions so that they can "hear" God speaking into their lives. As they recognize these evidences of God's grace, we pray that they can openly share them with others.

- This year we completed 12 of our regular fishing camps, which include our High C's Day Camps, Disabilities Camps and Overnight camps, it takes **75 or more guides** to help take our campers out on the waters and to provide a safe experience for our them.
- We tagged our Fishing Camps as "**The Camp That Goes Home With the Kid Program**", this means when our campers go back home, they have a booklet that helps them discuss what they learned during their day(s) at fish camp. This also means they are welcome to join any of our other camps to continue their journey with God and with others. This year we had **163 campers** join us at fish camp this year.
- Veteran events include our Dark House Sparring event, Crappie event, Armed Forces/AUSA Celebration, Muskie Mayhem and the Lake of the Woods Pay It Forward Trip. **This year we served over 475 Veterans.**
- Our other High C's Programs are: **Turkey Hunt** 13 kids, 14 volunteers, **Pheasant Hunt** 17 kids, 20 volunteers and 10 dogs **Deer camp** is expecting 7 campers with 9 adults. **Dark House Sparring Events**- 20 kids & 26 veterans, **Women's Ice Fishing event** 6 with 6 guides, **Firearm and Safety** 17, **Crappie Event**-150, **Lake Events**-25, **Trolling For Trophies**-10, **Deep C's Fall Retreat**-40 men & **Winter Retreats**-19 men.

Mission:9/11

One Fish For Every Life

On September 10-11, a Fishing for life team traveled to Sankoty Lakes Resort in Spring Bay IL for the annual Marathon Man event. This year marked the 20th anniversary of Sept 11th, so the goal was set to catch 2,977 fish which represented the 2,977 lives that were taken during the terrorist attacks—"Mission 9/11." During this event, seven-time world championship team member, brand manager for Johnson Outdoors and long-time partner with Fishing for life, Jeff Kolodzinski, a.k.a. "Marathon Man", fished for 24 hours straight, from September 10, 9:11pm through September 11, 9:11pm to try and beat his previous records set and to honor those that lost their lives on 9/11.

The Marathon Man was not fishing against others, he was fishing FOR others. Kolodzinski needed to catch more than 2 fish per minute for 24 hours straight to break his previous record. All Funds raised through this event went to Fishing For Life in support of our NextGEN Program and the local First Responders of Spring Bay, IL.

2,977 was a big number and the team believed after setting a Guinness world record at 2,143 more than 10 years ago that he could do this. Kolodzinski has consistently caught more fish throughout the years. In 2020, the Marathon Man caught 2,645 fish, his best catch ever. However, this meant he needed on average to catch 14 more fish per hour. In doing this endeavor, he fished the same way most new anglers do, by simply sitting on fishing pier, using a fishing pole, a bobber, and live bait.

Let me tell you... The fishing was great, as the fish were hungry and biting. As the Marathon Man neared his record setting number the crowd grew and you could feel the excitement. The atmosphere was fun, as there was



food, a lemonade stand, fire trucks followed by a massive fireworks display.

There was a moment of silence once the fish count reached 2,977. Kolodzinski gave a honoring speech to the crowd that had formed. And then he remarked that his time was not finished just as those that lost loved ones during the 9/11 attack, "they kept going and so must we... "

Kolodzinski continued fishing and reached an astounding tally of 3,168 fish. Not only did he knock his goal of 2,977 fish out of the water, he also helped to raise over \$50,000 for NextGEN and the Spring Bay First Responders.

Our NextGEN program provides a mentor and mentee pairing with intentional, consistent fishing and outdoor experiences, as well as meaningful spiritual guidance, for youth from military families and single parent households.

We are continually amazed by this event and how God comes in and uses his people to accomplish a big goal. We thank all those that supported this event by giving of their time, talent and treasures... A special thanks to the owners of Sankoty Lakes, Kim Blickenstaff, Dwayne Atherton, for providing a beautiful backdrop for this event, the Herman Brothers and their family for feeding everyone and helping to make all the arrangements necessary to make this event go off without a hitch. Thanks to Jeff Kolodzinski, Teeg Stouffer, Steve Worrall for keeping us captivated online for 24-hours. Many thanks to our sponsors and on-air interviewers, without this support, we could not do this event. And, of course all our behind the scenes people, you are amazing.
