More Than Fishing: Finding Community, Adventure, and Faith



For many women, life is spent caring for everyone else. We're driving kids to activities, helping aging parents, supporting spouses, serving at church, working our jobs, and keeping our households running. We spend so much time making sure everyone else has what they need that we often forget to make space for ourselves - to slow down, deepen friendships with other women, and grow in our faith. That's why Outdoor Women for Life (OWLs) exists.

At our January ice fishing event, a mother and daughter joined us for the first time, looking for something they could enjoy together - a chance to spend quality time away from the demands of life. They learned how to read sonar electronics, shared plenty of laughs, and experienced the thrill of catching fish side by side. Like many moms, the daughter is used to helping her children fish - but this time she got to be the one reeling in fish and celebrating the catch.

Her mother experienced something just as meaningful: uninterrupted time with her daughter in a new setting. By the end of the day, she had landed 11 fish and won the trophy for most inches caught. Since then, she has become more involved with Fishing For Life, volunteering at the Muskie Expo Trout Pond and helping

at another Trout Pond at a senior living facility where seniors, some who were in wheelchairs, experienced fishing. What started as a day on the ice grew into new friendships, new skills, and new ways to serve.

We continue to see these connections at OWLs events. At our June fishing event, two women discovered they were both veterans, exchanged phone numbers, and made plans to get together again. We also welcomed a woman who had recently moved to Minnesota and was hoping to find like-minded Christian women who share her love of the outdoors. She found OWLs through an online search, caught her first fishes of the year, and is already looking forward to returning in July.

OWLs is more than fishing, hiking, foraging, or shooting sports. It's a place to step away from life's constant demands, experience the wonder of God's creation, grow in faith, learn new skills, and build meaningful friendships. If you've been longing for community, encouragement, or a chance to simply breathe for a few hours, we'd love to have you join us. You may come for the activity - but chances are you'll come back for the friendships, the fellowship, and the reminder that you are deeply loved by God and created for community and connection.



Fishing For Life Expands Reel Hope Program with New Phase 4: Metro Camps

Fishing For Life is excited to announce the continued growth of our **Reel Hope Program** with the addition of an exciting new **Phase 4 – Metro Camps**, expanding opportunities for youth to deepen relationships, build confidence, and continue their outdoor journey through meaningful mentorship and hands-on experiences.

The Reel Hope Program empowers youth ages 8–17 through trusted relationships, outdoor experiences, and mentorship that build confidence and life skills through fishing. Participants progress through three foundational phases that introduce fishing skills, guided fishing experiences, and an all-expenses-paid boat fishing trip, helping youth grow in both confidence and connection along the way.

Now, Fishing For Life is proud to introduce **Phase 4 – Metro Camps**, designed for youth who are ready for a more immersive outdoor experience. These camps create opportunities for participants to strengthen skills, grow independence, deepen friendships, and continue learning in a safe, mentorship-driven environment that is close to home.

To date, Fishing For Life has hosted **two Metro Camps**, each creating memorable experiences and meaningful connections.

The first metro camp, **Reel Family Ice Camp**, was a parent/youth ice fishing experience on Medicine Lake that brought families together for a day of unplugging, learning new skills, and creating lasting memories on the ice. Watching families work together while enjoying quality time outdoors made the day especially impactful.

The second metro camp, **Reel Connections Camp**, held this spring at a local facility in Eden Prairie, provided participants with a memorable overnight adventure. Friday evening included fellowship around the campfire, a meaningful devotional, and fishing tips and tricks to prepare for the next day. Early Saturday morning,

participants headed to the shores of Lake Minnetonka where Fishing For Life guides welcomed them aboard boats and quickly got youth on the fish. Following a successful day on the water, campers returned for a short awards ceremony before heading home with new memories, skills, and confidence.

The adventure continues this summer with **Hooked on Hope**, scheduled for **July 17–19 at Baker Park Reserve**, offering even more opportunities for youth to grow through outdoor experiences, mentorship, and time outdoors. As Reel Hope continues to grow, so does the need for caring adults willing to invest in the next generation. Military R&R

Relationships Through Recreation Program

As Fishing For Life has grown over the years, we have increasingly focused our attention on Veterans and finding meaningful ways to help them move forward in a positive direction.

At one of our recent Relationships through Recreation (R&R) events, a veteran shared something deeply personal. He told me that since finding Fishing For Life, he has finally been able to spend time with other people in public without constantly fearing that something bad would happen.

Not long ago, whenever he would go out on a date with his wife, he felt the need to carry a pistol, extra magazines, and a knife just to feel safe. He would always sit with his back to the wall and make sure he had at least two exits in sight at all times. For him, hyper vigilance had become a way of life.

But through the relationships, trust, and sense of community he found at Fishing For Life, things slowly began to change.

Fishing For Life is an organization dedicated to helping military members and veterans cope with PTSD through fishing, relationships, recreation, and community connection.

One of our core programs is Relationships through Recreation (R&R). This program is designed to help veterans, wounded warriors, and their families reconnect through outdoor activities such as fishing trips, camps, and group events.

The R&R program is built around several key principles:

- **Peer Connection** — Veterans often feel more comfortable connecting with others who share similar life experiences and challenges.
- **Nature and Recreation** — Fishing and outdoor activities can help reduce stress, anxiety, and emotional fatigue while promoting calm and focus.
- **Relationship Rebuilding** — Many of our programs include spouses, children, mentors, and caregivers to help strengthen family bonds and social support systems.
- **Non-Clinical Support** — Not every veteran is ready to engage in formal therapy. Recreational programs can provide a trusted and approachable pathway toward healing and personal growth.

There is growing evidence that fishing and outdoor recreation can positively impact veterans dealing with PTSD by reducing isolation, improving emotional regulation, and restoring a sense of connection and purpose. Research involving fishing programs for veterans found that participants described the experience as a “breather” from PTSD symptoms and a way to regain control, peace, and community.

Stories like this veterans are why Fishing For Life continues this mission. Healing does not always begin in a clinic or counseling office. Sometimes it begins in a boat, on a dock, around a campfire, or beside someone who simply understands.

Cast the Net Campaign

From Cast to Christ, from Net to Disciple

At Fishing For Life, we often say that ministry happens in the moments between casts — in conversations on the dock, quiet reflections in a boat, or shared experiences in God's creation that open hearts in unexpected ways.

For years, Fishing For Life has faithfully lived out its mission: **CONNECTING PEOPLE TO CHRIST THROUGH FISHING & OUTDOOR PROGRAMS.**

That mission remains at the center of everything we do — whether serving youth searching for purpose, veterans seeking connection and healing, families spending meaningful time together, or individuals taking steps of faith in a Christ-centered community.

We build relationships first, earning the trust of veterans, youth, and volunteers so we can speak truth into their lives while extending love and support.

As the ministry continues to grow and opportunities expand, so does the need to thoughtfully prepare for the future. That preparation is what has led to an important next step for Fishing For Life: the early rollout of the **Cast the Net Capital Campaign.**

While still in an early phase and not yet publicly launched, *Cast the Net* represents an exciting and prayerful effort to strengthen the ministry's foundation for years to come.

At its heart, *Cast the Net* is about stewardship — building the capacity to serve more people, more effectively, while staying deeply rooted in the mission God has entrusted to us.

The campaign focuses on three strategic priorities that together will help Fishing For Life continue reaching youth, veterans, and families through outdoor experiences centered on Christ.

1. BUILD FOUR WALLS

One of the most significant goals of *Cast the Net* is the development of a permanent Urban Base Camp in the Twin Cities metro area.

For over 20 years, Fishing For Life has faithfully adapted without a central home base. Programs have



grown, equipment has moved from place to place, and staff and volunteers have continually found creative ways to make ministry happen wherever the opportunity exists.

But growth has also revealed an important reality: our ministry needs a home.

The envisioned Urban Base Camp would increase accessibility for those in and around the metro area who may not be able to attend programs farther from home. It would create another meaningful point of connection for youth, veterans, and families seeking community and faith-based support.

Just as importantly, this space would provide a permanent gathering space where volunteers can be equipped, discipleship can happen year-round, equipment can be securely stored, and ministry preparation can occur more efficiently.

In many ways, this vision is not simply about a building. It is about creating a stronger foundation for ministry impact.

2. BUILD CAPACITY

Fishing For Life's ministry has always happened where people naturally encounter God's creation — on the water, around campfires, on docks, and in shared outdoor experiences.

Those moments matter.

They are often where relationships form, trust grows, and meaningful faith conversations begin.

To continue providing safe, high-quality experiences, *Cast the Net* also includes plans to strengthen ministry capacity through investments in boats, trailers, fishing gear, outdoor equipment, maintenance, and training resources.

While these practical needs may not always be the most visible part of ministry, they are essential to creating opportunities for connection and discipleship.

Quality ministry requires quality people, and creating an

environment with the right tools, support, and resources that help attract, equip, and retain strong leaders who can faithfully serve for years to come.

Simply put, expanding capacity means expanding opportunities to serve.

3. BUILD DISCIPLES

Perhaps the most meaningful focus of *Cast the Net* is its commitment to discipleship.

Fishing For Life has never been solely about fishing. Rather, fishing provides the setting for something deeper — authentic relationships, spiritual conversations, mentorship, encouragement, and opportunities for people to encounter Christ.

The campaign seeks to expand support for discipleship efforts, chaplaincy, and accessible programming so finances never become a barrier to participation.

The goal is not merely to increase attendance or host more events. It is to deepen impact — helping more people grow in faith and experience the love of Christ through meaningful relationships and outdoor experiences.

ENCOURAGING EARLY MOMENTUM

Although the campaign remains in its early stages, there is already much to be thankful for.

Initial conversations with ministry friends, supporters, and trusted partners have been encouraging. There is growing excitement about what this next chapter could mean for Fishing For Life and for the countless lives touched through its programs.

Perhaps most encouraging is the shared belief that the mission matters now more than ever.

In a world where many experience loneliness, uncertainty, and disconnection, opportunities for authentic relationships and Christ-centered community remain deeply needed.

Fishing has always been the invitation.

Jesus remains the destination.

As Fishing For Life prayerfully continues the rollout of *Cast the Net*, we are deeply grateful for every volunteer, donor, participant, and supporter who has helped carry the ministry forward over the years.

There is still much work ahead, but there is also great hope.

Because every cast holds possibility — and every life reached matters.

Fishing For Life is pleased to welcome Danny Benson as the new Program Coordinator for the Reel Hope and Metro Camp programs.

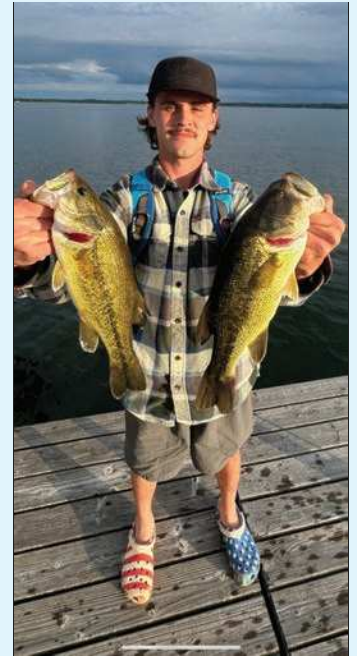

2026 Ice Castle Ministry

Thanks to the generous donation of a second Ice Castle in 2025 by Sandy Younger, Fishing For Life was able to operate two Ice Castles during the 2026 ice fishing season. The additional shelter allowed us to serve more families and create even more opportunities for people to experience the joy of ice fishing.

This winter, 35 families/groups participated in the Ice Castle Ministry, with many of them enjoying their very first ice fishing adventure. For many participants, it was more than just a day on the ice—it was an opportunity to spend quality time together, learn new skills, and create lasting memories in the outdoors. Throughout the season, the shelters provided a warm, comfortable, and welcoming environment for families and anglers regardless of their previous fishing experience.

One of the greatest rewards of the ministry is introducing people to the sport of fishing. Watching first-time anglers catch fish, learn about the outdoors, and share excitement with family members is what makes this program so special. This year our OWLs chapter enjoyed a day on the lake in the ice castles enjoying learning together, Veterans and their families enjoyed the day inside at Holes 4 Heroes, we hosted local high schoolers through our Reel Hope Program and FFL had an additional 88 people through our ice castle ministry.

We would like to share just a few notes from those who were able to get out on the ice with us.

In 2026, we are excited to offer 12 veteran-focused events as part of our Military Relationships through Recreation (R&R) Program, including two new additions: **Gunnin' for Gobblers** and the **Reel Heroes Fishing Event**.

These events are designed to provide veterans with opportunities to reconnect, build friendships, and find healing through time spent outdoors with others who understand their experiences. By intentionally expanding our Military R&R Program, we are reaching more veterans and families than ever before.

The Reel Heroes Fishing Event at Lake Reno Resort brought together veterans for three days of fishing, fellowship, and encouragement. While catching fish was certainly part of the experience, the greatest impact came from the relationships formed and the support shared among participants.

Throughout the event, veterans spent time on the water with volunteer boat guides, shared meals, exchanged stories, and connected with fellow service members who understand the challenges that can come with military service. For many attendees, these connections are just as valuable as the fishing itself.

Several veterans shared how Fishing For Life has positively impacted their lives:

"Fishing For Life has helped me get out of the house and start interacting with other people. This trip was a great experience."

"Fishing For Life has been a place that brings peace to me. No matter the weather, it's the group of veterans that makes it special. I also caught my personal best sunfish at 1.4 pounds."

"It was an awesome time. The camaraderie and talking with other vets was terrific."

"Thank you, Fishing For Life, for introducing me to some wonderful veterans I can now call friends."

These comments remind us that the true value of these events goes far beyond fishing. For many veterans living with PTSD and other service-related challenges, isolation can be one of the biggest obstacles they face. Through outdoor recreation, shared experiences, and authentic relationships, veterans find community, encouragement, and hope.

Fishing For Life is grateful for the volunteer boat guides, supporters, sponsors, and the team at Lake Reno Resort who make these events possible. Together, we are creating opportunities for healing, building lasting friendships, and honoring those who have served our nation.

As we look ahead to the remainder of the 2026 season, we are excited to continue expanding our reach and helping more veterans and their families experience the restorative power of the outdoors.

The Mobile Trout Pond quickly became a favorite stop for families. For some children, it wasn't just their first time catching a trout, it was their very first fish. Parents gathered with cameras, siblings cheered one another on, and smiles spread around the pond as new memories were made.

Families also enjoyed our archery and BB gun ranges, creating opportunities to experience the outdoors in a safe, fun environment. Throughout the weekend, our team also connected with fellow vendors, industry leaders, and outdoor organizations, sharing the mission of Fishing For Life and the many ways we use the outdoors to build relationships and serve our communities.

Behind every successful event is an incredible team of volunteers. Throughout the weekend, volunteers donated more than 126 hours of their time, including 42 hours served by Military Veteran volunteers. The camp began with one of the most important aspects of becoming a responsible hunter—firearm safety. Every participant completed the in-person portion of the Minnesota Firearm Safety Course or received a refresher if already certified. Campers also spent time learning turkey hunting fundamentals, including habitat, calling techniques, decoy placement, ethical hunting practices, and proper game care.

While learning new outdoor skills was a major focus, the true heart of camp was found in the relationships that were built. One of the highlights was watching longtime camper Max step into a leadership role by leading several devotionals.
